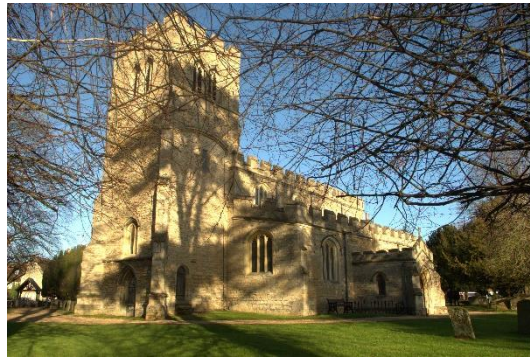

Not only did it give us a global pandemic, but it gave us a whole new vocabulary to go along with it: social distancing, lockdown, the rule of six, Covid-secure, key workers, and self-isolation, to name but a few. And though we enter into a new year, the virus doesn't know that;

both it and the new vocabulary will unfortunately continue with us for some time into 2021.

And yet, this new year there is reason for at least some hope: various vaccinations have begun to be administered, and all of us look forward to the time when we will enjoy again physical interaction, the security of economic productivity, and, of course, good health.

However, perhaps now is a good time to be reminded of Winston Churchill's statement to: "Never waste a good crisis." Churchill made this statement towards the end of WW2, in reference to how the war had brought the United Kingdom, America, and Russia together, and would ultimately lead to the forming of the United Nations.

This year, as we continue our own war on Covid-19, it is worth noting the many ways in which our community has 'not wasted' this global pandemic. Amongst the pain and hardship there have been real demonstrations of community spirit, and sacrificial generosity towards one another. On top of these, another positive is something a little more existential: rediscovering that we are but creatures, and that we are not the masters of our fate.

'Never waste a good crisis' is far more than the sentiment of 'every cloud has a silver lining', it is rooted in the core belief of Christianity: God is more than able to bring great good out of immense evil and suffering. Nothing is wasted in his economy. This belief is at the very centre of the Gospels: the great evil of the crucifixion of the Son of God was used by God as the very means of his salvation, forgiveness, and peace.

This year we will continue to face hardship and difficulties, however, can I encourage you to do so, trusting in the God who has promised to, "work all things together for the good of those who love him".
